What is RCE YOUTH?

RCE Youth is an initiative of the 10th Global RCE Meeting held in November 2016 to engage youth people globally to support ESD in their local regions. To become a youth focal point you must:

- 35 years of age and under
- Connected and involved in your RCE
- Commit for a term of 2 years

Why join the youth network?

By becoming a youth focal point you will be able to connect, work and share with youth globally, while supporting your RCE efforts in your local community. Active involved could also assist with travel scholarships to your regional RCE conference. Your work will be acknowledged by the UNU-IAS which will also be beneficial for future employment.

What are your responsibilities?

As a youth focal point you are required to:

- Develop, initiate, and communicate about new and ongoing cross-RCE activities related to ESD and Youth in their RCE, region, and country
- Stay up-to-date on relevant youth platforms and activities tied to ESD/SD in the country and region
- Communicate with the coordinator(s) of her/his RCE in regards to RCE activities and meetings.
- Develop and update profiles for their RCE on the RCE portal
- Develop, update, and contribute to websites and/ or social media related to their RCE as applicable
- Assist in the annual reporting of RCE activities and stakeholders
- Communicate with different institutions within the RCE (including schools, universities, local governments, NGOs, private sector, etc.) to receive updates on relevant activities and meetings.
- Communicate with different RCEs within their nation/region to coordinate and upscale youth projects/activities among the RCEs
- Provide a brief report (approximately 500 words, every quarter of the year) on RCE activities related to Youth and submit it to their regional focal point or national focal point.
