


First Earth Day - 1970

UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development 2005-2014



Mission: integrate the principles, values and practices of sustainable development into all aspects of education and learning. Encourage changes in behavior that will create a more sustainable future in terms of environmental integrity, economic viability and a just society for present and future generations.

Regional Centers of Expertise in ESD (RCE)

- ► Acknowledged by United Nations University
- Multi-sector networks using formal, non-formal, and informal education, public awareness, and training to build more sustainable communities
- ▶ 136 RCEs around the world; 4 in the U.S.



Aichi-Nagoya Declaration:

"We resolve to promote ESD and to integrate sustainable development more actively into education beyond the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (2005-2014)."



GAP Vision, Goal, and Objectives

➤ Vision: "a world where everybody has the opportunity to benefit from education and learn the values, behavior and lifestyles required for a sustainable future and for positive societal transformation."

► Goal: "to generate and scale up action in all levels and areas of education and learning to accelerate progress towards sustainable development."

▶ Objective 1 "to reorient education and learning so that everyone has the opportunity to acquire the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes that empower them to contribute to sustainable development"

Objective 2 "to strengthen education and learning in all agendas, programmes and activities that promote sustainable development"


